Trustee Emeritus Steve Schwartz '70 Among Producers of The Road

Story posted November 30, 2009 Trustee Emeritus Steve Schwartz '70, president of Chockstone Pictures, and his wife, Paula Mae, are two of three producers behind the new film, *The Road*, based on the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel by Cormac McCarthy, author of *No Country for*

Old Men. Nick Wechsler, the third producer on the film, also produced The Time Traveler's Wife.

The Road, which was released November 25, 2009, stars Viggo Mortensen and Kodi Smit-McPhee as a father and his son in a post-apocalyptic wasteland. The two struggle to survive as they make their way toward the coast for possible safety and to look for other survivors. The movie also features Charlize Theron and Robert Duvall.



In 1990, Steve and Paula Mae Schwartz, who split their time between Malibu, Calif., and Gloucester, Mass., founded Schwartz Communications, one of the leading public relations agencies in the U.S. With headquarters in Waltham, Mass., the agency also maintains offices in London, San Francisco and Stockholm.
